Jude 1:24 Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy, **25** to the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen. *ESV*

For Reflection & Application:

Monday:

Read Jude 1:24-25. Jude writes his letter explaining a worrisome problem, but he wraps up the letter with praise to God. What does this suggest about the connection between problems and praise?

Tuesday:

Jude 1:24 says "Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling . . ." How can this be a basis for praise? (See also Psalm 46:1; Philippians 4:12-13; 2 Corinthians 12:9; Romans 8:35, 37.) Suggested prayer: Lord, on my own, I am bound to stumble badly. But as I trust in you and keep myself in your love, you keep me from stumbling. I thank you and praise you for your power that works within me for my growth and my good. Amen.

Wednesday:

Jude 1:24 says ". . . to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy," How can this be a basis for praise? (See also Romans 8:1; Psalm 103:11-12; John 5:24; Colossians 1:21-22; Romans 8:18.) Suggested prayer: Lord, I thank you that, in Christ, I am forgiven and blameless and reconciled to you. Because of what Christ has done for me, I have a glorious and joyous future awaiting me in heaven, and for that, I praise you. Amen.

Thursday:

Jude 1:25 says "to the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord." How can this be a basis for praise? (See also Isaiah 53:5; Acts 4:12; John 14:6; 1 Timothy 2:5; 1 Peter 2:24.) Suggested prayer: Lord, you alone are God, and Christ alone is my only salvation, my only hope. By his wounds I am healed. By your grace, I am yours. I praise you and thank you. Amen.

Friday:

Jude 1:25 says "Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling . . ." How can this be a basis for praise? (See also Psalm 104:24; 1 Timothy 1:17; Psalm 8:1; Psalm 145:13; Colossians 1:16-17.) Suggested prayer: Lord, I am so grateful to be a child of the King, whose glory is unmatched, whose majesty is unparalleled, whose dominion is unending, whose authority is unrivaled. Who am I that I should be so privileged and so loved? Amen.
