Reread Proverbs 18:5, 7, 20–21. Given the effect of words on the one who speaks them, how can you apply this wisdom to your life today? Be specific.

## Friday:

Reread Proverbs 18:4, 8. Given the effect of words on others, how can you apply this wisdom to your life today? Be specific.
