For Reflection & Application:

Monday:

Read Proverbs 18:3 and 1 John 2:28. What is the central idea of Proverbs 18:3, and how is it related to 1 John 2:28? How can you apply the idea to your life today?

Tuesday:

In light of Proverbs 18:3 and 1 John 2:28, is shame good or bad? Why? What is the difference between deserved and undeserved shame? Can you give examples from your own life?

Wednesday:

Read Proverbs 18:9. What is the central idea of this verse? Which area of your life stands out to you as needing more diligence?

Thursday:

Read Proverbs 18:22 and 1 Corinthians 7:7. How are the two verses related? What is the central idea? Do you more often view your spouse or your singleness as a given or a gift? What difference does it make?

Friday:

In light of Proverbs 18:22 and 1 Corinthians 7:7, in what specific way can you outwardly reflect the reality that your spouse or your singleness is a gift?

Lord, I am grateful for the wisdom you give me in Scripture. Help me to apply your wisdom not only so that my life might be richer, but so that your name might be greater in and through me.
